When To Consult With Tribes Under Section 106

Section 106 requires consultation with federally-recognized Indian tribes when a project may affect a historic property of religious and cultural significance to the tribe. Historic properties of religious and cultural significance include: archeological sites, burial grounds, sacred landscapes or features, ceremonial areas, traditional cultural places, traditional cultural landscapes, plant and animal communities, and buildings and structures with significant tribal association. The types of activities that may affect historic properties of religious and cultural significance include: ground disturbance (digging), new construction in undeveloped natural areas, introduction of incongruent visual, audible, or atmospheric changes, work on a building with significant tribal association, and transfer, lease or sale of properties of the types listed above.

If a project includes any of the types of activities below, invite tribes to consult:

- significant ground disturbance (digging)**
Examples: new sewer lines, utility lines (above and below ground), foundations, footings, grading, access roads
- new construction in undeveloped natural areas**
Examples: industrial-scale energy facilities, transmission lines, pipelines, or new recreational facilities, in undeveloped natural areas like mountaintops, canyons, islands, forests, native grasslands, etc., and housing, commercial, and industrial facilities in such areas
- incongruent visual changes**
Examples: construction of a focal point that is out of character with the surrounding natural area, impairment of the vista or viewshed from an observation point in the natural landscape, or impairment of the recognized historic scenic qualities of an area
- incongruent audible changes**
Examples: increase in noise levels above an acceptable standard in areas known for their quiet, contemplative experience
- incongruent atmospheric changes**
Examples: introduction of lights that create skyglow in an area with a dark night sky
- work on a building with significant tribal association**
Examples: rehabilitation, demolition or removal of a surviving ancient tribal structure or village, or a building or structure that there is reason to believe was the location of a significant tribal event, home of an important person, or that served as a tribal school or community hall
- transfer, lease or sale of a historic property of religious and cultural significance**
Example: transfer, lease or sale of properties that contain archeological sites, burial grounds, sacred landscapes or features, ceremonial areas, plant and animal communities, or buildings and structures with significant tribal association

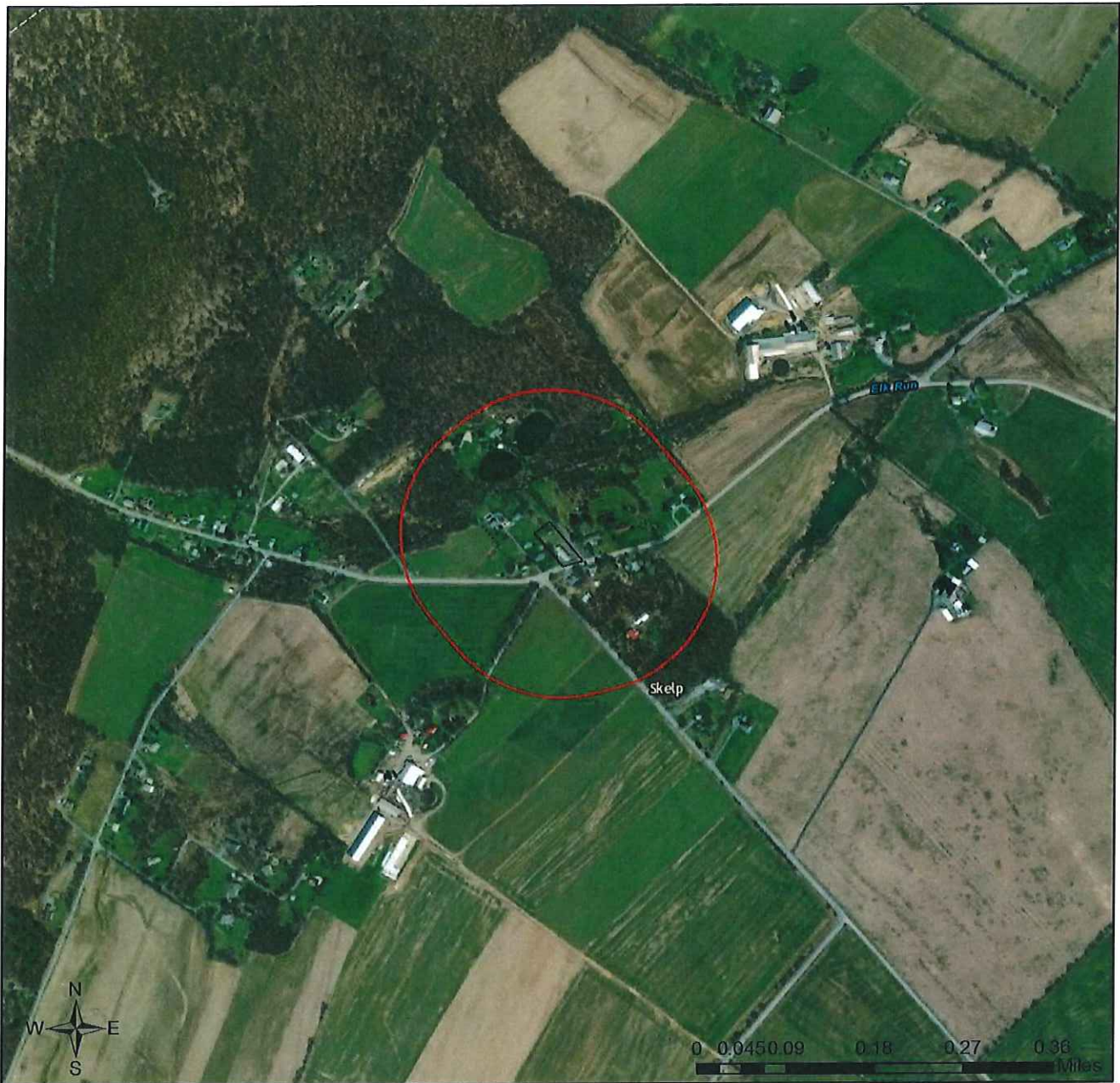

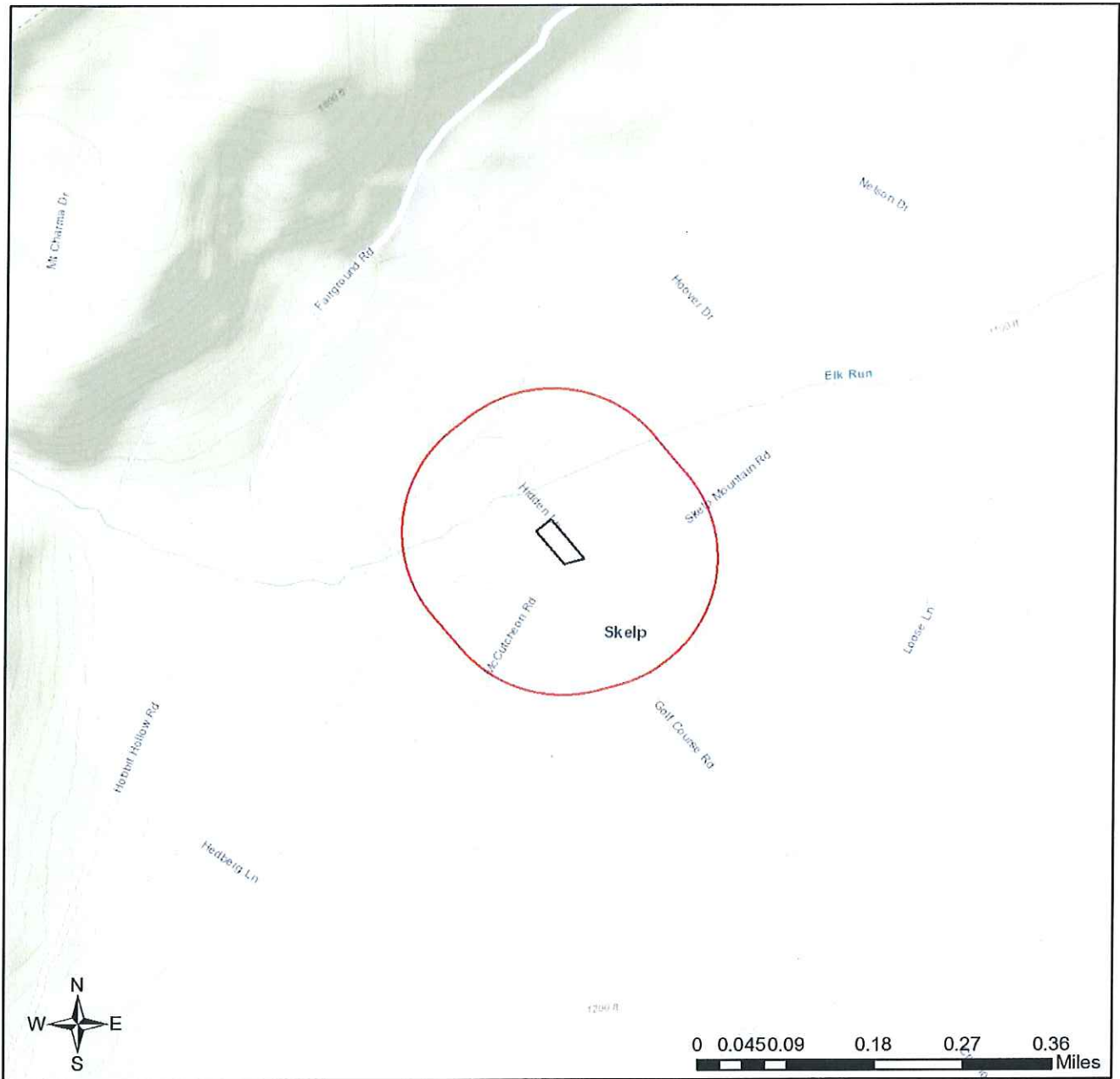

The staff of the Blair County Planning Commission reports that the Demolition of Sinking Valley Grange Hall project, located at 109 Hidden Lane in Tyrone Township, utilizing Community Development Block Grant funds, is generally consistent with the *Alleghenies Ahead* Regional Comprehensive Plan, which includes comprehensive planning for Blair County.

While the Blair County Planning Commission is an advocate for adaptive reuse of structures, and would prefer that this structure be rehabilitated for continued use, it is understandable that when a structure reaches a point where it becomes a safety hazard and is in a state of disrepair where it is no longer feasible to renovate the structure, that demolition becomes the only economically viable option. Provided that this is in fact the case for this structure where no other viable alternative exists, and provided that the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission has been consulted with in order to assess and document the historical nature of the property, then the Blair County Planning Commission does not oppose the proposed demolition of this structure.

Environmentally, this proposed project is not anticipated to have negative impacts on any of the areas of statutory or regulatory compliance. Any unforeseen impacts on these resources as a result of the above mentioned project should be identified and mitigated throughout the standard environmental assessment process.

To recap, Tyrone Township who owns the Sinking Valley Grange Hall #484 has applied to the County's CDBG program for funding to raze the Hall building and some minor outbuildings on the site.

The CDBG funds are federal entitlement allocations initiated by US Dept of HUD and are subject to NEPA requirements. As part of the environmental review process and NEPA, the County must coordinate and engage interested parties to the use of the federal funds that could have a potential impact to the environment and areas such as historical impacts.

The State Historical Preservation Office (SHPO) has suggested the County contact Grange organizations, 4H clubs or PSU extension office to identify sources who understand the role granges played in the history of agriculture in Pennsylvania and how this Sinking Valley Grange Hall reflects those trends.

Questions SHPO is asking the County to consider.

Questions to be answered include does this building replace an earlier grange in the same community or location? How does this building compare to other granges that remain in Blair County (online research shows there were at least 5 others)? Do any of those grange buildings remain? Are those other grange halls in Blair County of similar design to this one? Are those granges older than this one or larger or still functional? How has this grange building changed over time since it was first built?

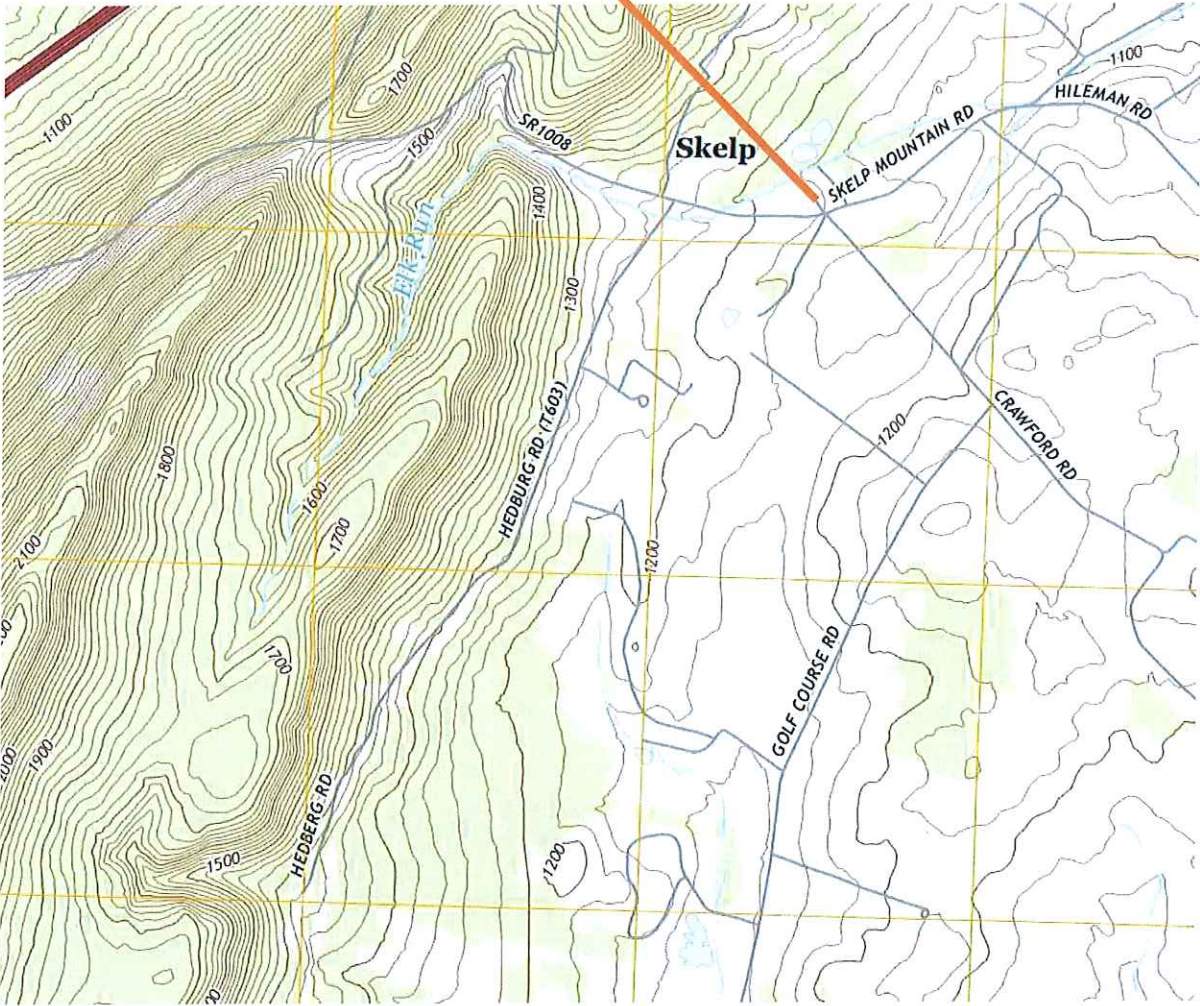

Project Proposal – Tyrone Township Meeting Hall Demolition

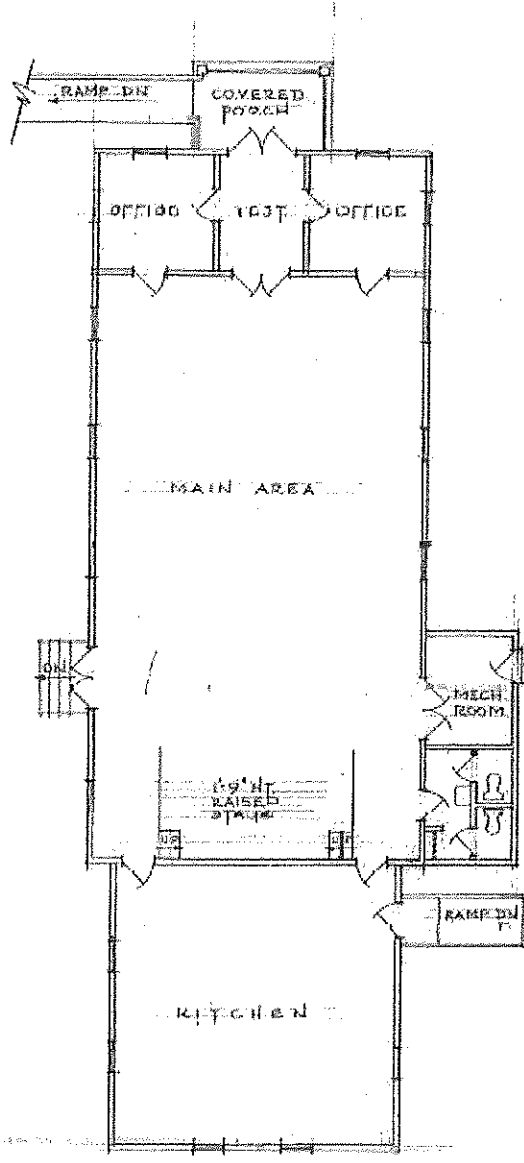
A. Description

Tyrone Township purchased the Sinking Valley Grange Hall from Sinking Valley Grange 484 on May 12, 2011 for the intended use of an office building/meeting space. Prior to this purchase the township rented the assembly area for their monthly meetings. The building lot consists of an approximate 36'x84' (2,400 square feet) wood frame, single level building, a storage shed, a pavilion, along with utilities of water, septic, and electricity. The facility, located at 109 Hidden Lane, Tyrone, PA, is approximately 80 years old and is currently in poor condition and not safe for residents to enter. Tyrone Township is seeking financial assistance through this grant program to demolish this facility due to the sagging roof line, deteriorating floor joists, mold growth in the restrooms, peeling paint on the ceilings, and the fact that the building is a safety hazard to our residents. The building has not been used since January 2019 and the electricity has been turned off at the main to reduce the costs of maintaining this site. Razing this facility will allow the township to determine plans for future use of the space such as creating a public park, picnic area, or other use that would be safe for residents. Photos and a drawing of the facility are attached for reference.

A building inspection done by Keller Engineers in 2010 itemized needed building repairs totaling \$83,500. Ten years later and adding the cost of inflation we are now looking at over \$100,000 to repair a facility that is approximately 80 years old. This makes it even harder to justify the expense of repairing the facility, compared to replacing it. Improvement cost estimates included in the 2010 inspection included:

i. Accessible parking area w/walk to ramp	\$2,900.00
ii. New furnace	\$3,800.00
iii. New roof	\$15,800.00
iv. New roof sheathing	\$3,400.00
v. Remodel existing and install new restrooms	\$21,300.00
vi. Attic insulation (12" blown-in)	\$4,600.00
vii. Exterior wall insulation (blown-in)	\$5,900.00
viii. Replace doors at vestibule and kitchen	\$3,200.00
ix. Stage removal/floor replacement	\$1,700.00
x. Emergency lighting system/exit signs	\$1,600.00
xi. Exterminator	\$1,400.00
xii. Commercial kitchen exhaust hood	\$8,900.00
xiii. Grease/oil interceptor at sewage line	\$3,200.00
xiv. Interior/exterior cosmetic improvements	\$5,800.00

The township would like to raze the building by the fall, if feasible. If not, then we intend to complete demolition by the end of 2020. Demolition could take place as soon as the contractors schedule permits and the demolition permit are secured.

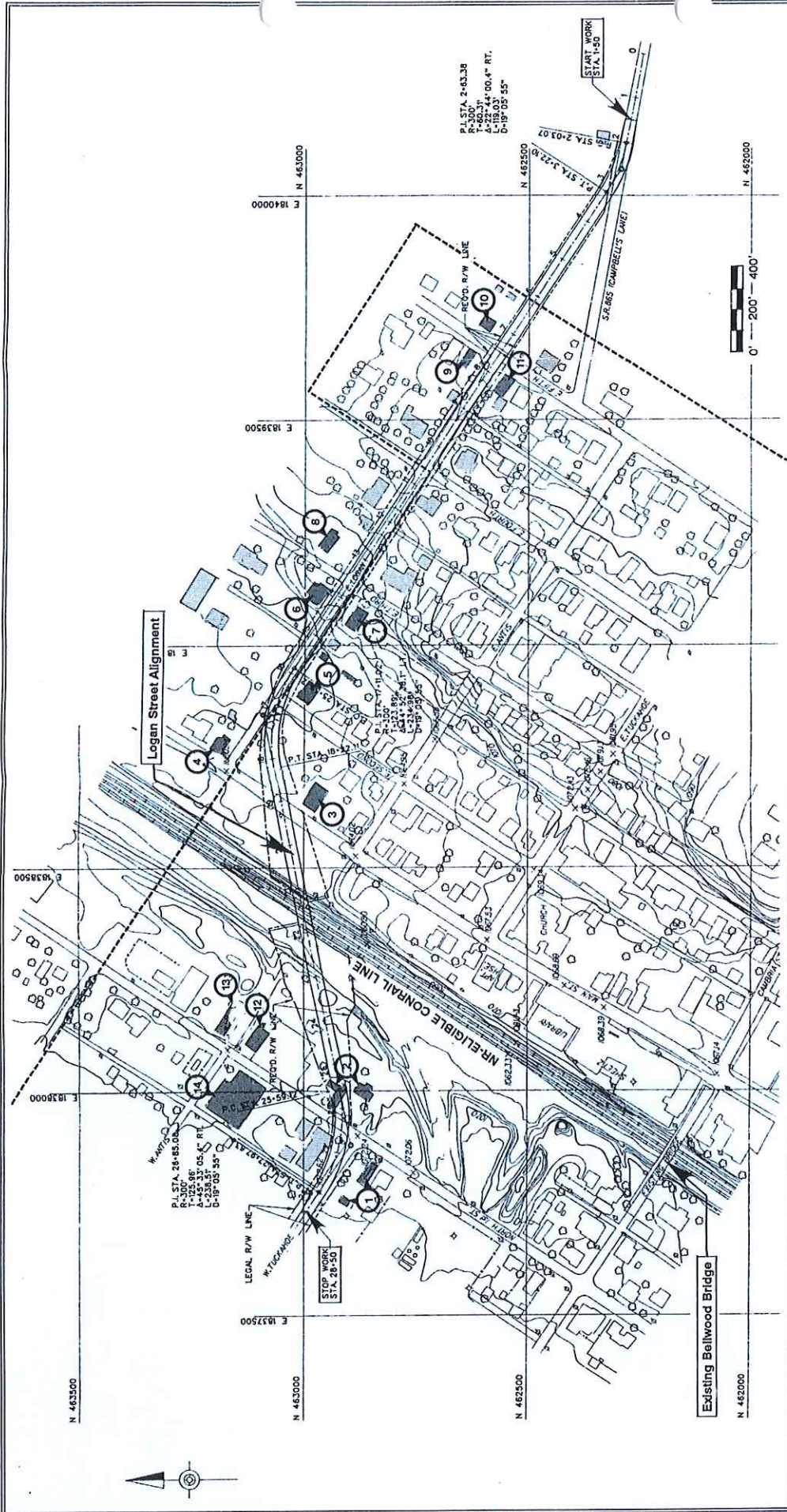


Figure 4: Survey Results Map (Map 1 of 2)

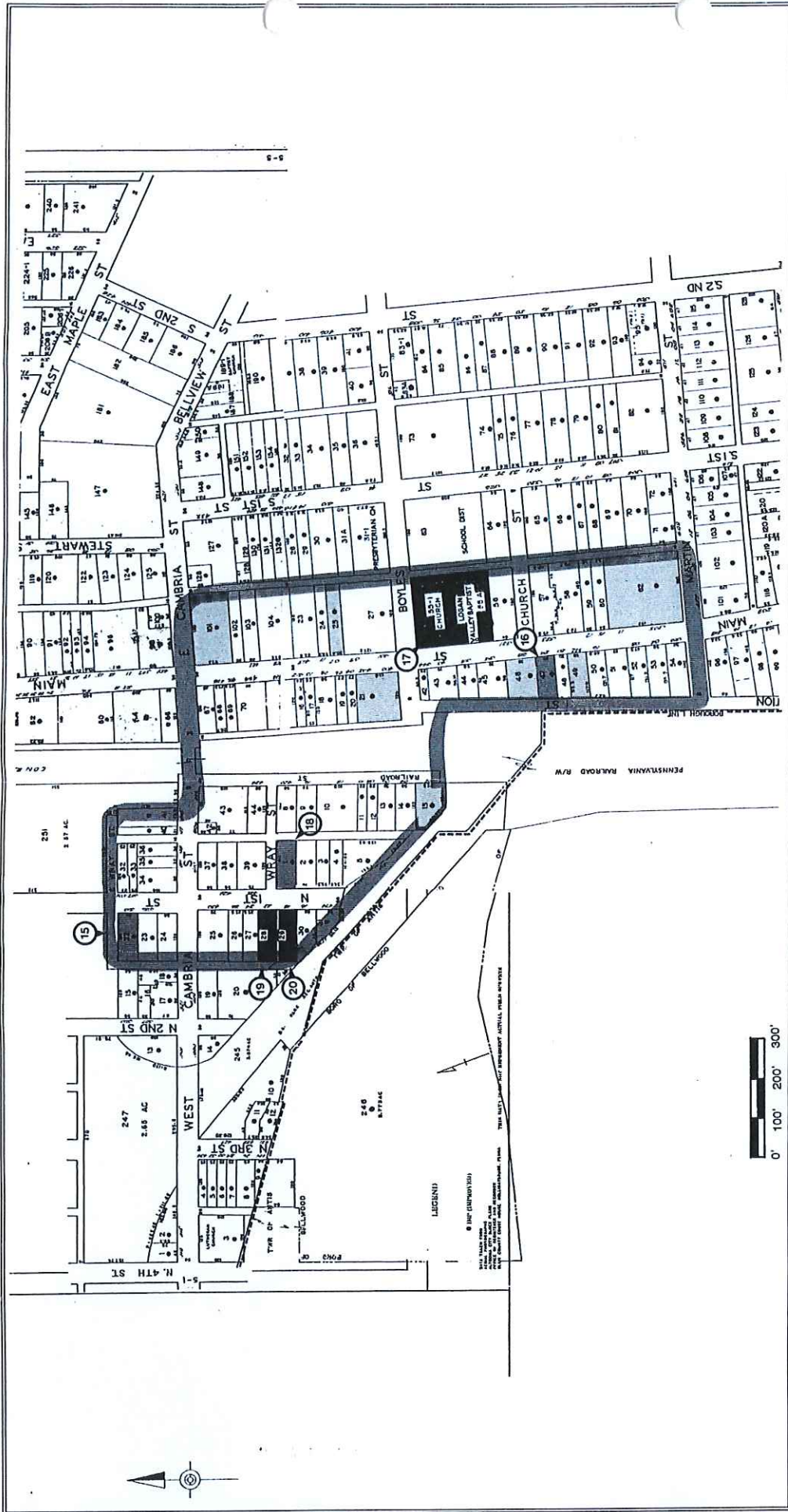


Figure 4: Survey Results Map (Map 2 of 2)
