AND NOW, this 31 day of May, 2018, in conjunction with the Blair County Court of Common Pleas and in recognition of the benefits of expediting criminal cases involving the offense(s) of Driving Under the Influence, it is hereby **ORDERED** and **DECREED** by the Magisterial District Courts of Blair County, Pennsylvania that the August 31, 2010 Order docketed at MD-1524-2010 is hereby **REAFFIRMED** as follows:


1. Preliminary Hearings on criminal cases involving the charge of Driving under the Influence shall be scheduled three (3) weeks from the date of filing at a Magisterial District Court.
2. Continuance requests from the Commonwealth/Defendant/Defense Counsel will **NOT** be granted unless the Magisterial District Judge determines there is an extenuating circumstance that will result in a potential hardship and/or prejudice.
3. The general unavailability of the Commonwealth/Defendant/Defense Counsel due to scheduling reasons will **NOT** constitute an extenuating circumstance.

4. Any continuance request granted due to an extenuating circumstance on case involving the charge of Driving under the Influence shall be continued for one (1) week.






