Commissioner Erb called for commissioner comments.

Commissioner Webster announced that she would like to take a moment to recognize the Blair County Public Works building and maintenance staff for the extra demand of cleaning and sanitizing the Courthouse building.

Commissioner Burke stated that the County now ranks 43<sup>rd</sup> out of 67 Counties in the Robert Wood Johnson County Health Ranking Report of Pennsylvania Counties. Healthy Blair County did have to cancel their step challenge that was set to start in March due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

#### **Emergency Management Agency:**

Katherine Swigart and Mark Taylor requested approval of a Rate and Service Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the County of Blair and Microtel Inn & Suites Altoona for overnight accommodations as needed during the COVID-19 Pandemic, at a rate of \$49.00 per night.

Chief Clerk Hemminger stated that the employees recognized as First Responders as outlined by the Department of Labor (Caseworkers in CYF, Sheriff Deputies, EMA, 911 Center, Prison, Public Works, Adult Parole and Probation and Juvenile Probation) would be eligible for the hotel room accommodations as outlined in the MOU with the Microtel.

Katherine Swigart stated that the trigger for the use of the hotel would follow the COVID-19 Protocols distributed to employees on April 3, 2020. The sections of the protocol include:

Box D: Respiratory symptoms of the employee but a question as to the cause

Box E: COVID symptoms of the employee

Box H: Positive Case of COVID exposure but not the employee

Box I: Employee presumed infected but not confirmed

- Box J: Employee is positive for COVID
- Box J: Coworker infected with COVID

Ms. Swigart stated that the Human Resources Department will take the lead on arranging for the employee's accommodations.

Discussion followed.

Motion by Commissioner Erb, Second by Commissioner Burke and unanimously approved to adopt Resolution 176-2020.

Trina Illig requested approval of an Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) submission for FY2020 in the amount of \$560,447.

Ms. Illig stated that Blair Community Action and Family Services Inc. have requested ESG funds in areas of Rapid Rehousing, Homeless Prevention, Street Outreach, Emergency Shelter, Case Management, administration fees and for a total request application of \$581,463.00.

**<u>Resolution 177-2020</u>**: A Resolution approving a proposed 2020 County of Blair Emergency Solutions Project to be funded by a grant in the amount of \$581,463 to the PA Department of Community and Economic Development.

Motion by Commissioner Erb, second by Commissioner Burke and unanimously approved to adopt Resolution 177-2020.

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

## SB 841 signed into law as Act 15 of 2020

Discussion concerning Act 15 of 2020 regarding the discount and penalty provisions for local tax collection.

Commissioner Erb stated that the Board of Commissioners held a Special Meeting to discuss SB 841 the prior week. SB 841 was signed into law by the governor yesterday which allows counties to extend the discount period and remove the penalty percentage on property tax collections.

Commissioner Erb asked Solicitor Karn if there was any flexibility of the dates stated in the law for the extension of the discount period or change to the penalty phase. Solicitor Karn stated there was no flexibility in the dates.

Commissioner Webster stated that this legislation would allow for additional months for taxpayers to pay at a discounted rate. Commissioner Webster stated she supports the extension only. She does not support the elimination of the penalty period. The Coronavirus has effected Blair County residents throughout the months of April and May, which are the months the discount period is offered. Businesses were closed resulting in a loss of revenue and taxpayers have been laid off or lost their jobs as a result of the closures.

Commissioner Burke stated her concern in the short time period for the notice of the extension of the discount period.

Commissioner Erb stated there is a projected revenue loss of approximately \$112,000.00 if extending the discount period and \$219,000.00 if the penalty phase is eliminated. Adding to that would be unknown expenses that can not be quantified such as unbudgeted interest payments to continue to borrow money on the Tax Anticipation Note until tax payments come in.

Commissioner Erb reminded the other two commissioners that the prior Board voted to keep a lower tax increase, under 4%, and balance the 2020 budget with reserve funds. The Counties reserve funds are lower than recommended guidelines at \$3,000,000.00.

Commissioner Erb stated that the median average home is \$126,100.00. County tax on that property is \$513.82. The 2% discount equates to \$10.28 for the taxpayer however has a significant impact on the County finances.

Controller Stickel stated that as of this morning the County has a little over \$6,000,000 in the bank. If the discount period is extended and taxpayers wait to send in their payments until August 31, 2020 the County will face payroll payments of over \$7,000,000.00, health insurance premiums over \$2,000,000.00, an outstanding Tax Anticipation Note balance of \$1,500,000.00 and retirement contributions of more than \$2,200,000.00. These numbers do not account for any day-to-day accounts payable.

Commissioner Burke stated that often times hard decisions need to be made with very little information. Departments are coming to the Commissioners asking for out of the ordinary items to accomplish social distancing with the impression that Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency (PEMA) or the Federal Government will provide reimbursement.

Like the questions reguarding reimbursement, many questions are still left without answers. These answers would make today's decision much easier: How many banks hold tax payments in escrow and how many of these payments have been remitted to the County? Commissioner Burke stated that she feels extending the discount period could result in a tax increase next year.

Commissioner Erb stated that if the County is unable to pay off the Tax Anticipation Note for any reason at the end of the year that this would result in refinancing the Note into long term debt which would damage the financial position of the County and also the credit rating for future borrowing.

Commissioner Webster stated that she feels banks, which may not be local, will not be aware of the extension for the tax money held in escrow and the payments to the County would not be delayed. She stated that she feels that the banks do not have the ability, as the fiduciary of the escrow money, to pay any later than the original discount deadline.

Commissioner Erb stated that it would be very naïve to believe that the banks would not be monitoring the County's action on the law closely. Banks play the "float" to earn additional interest on escrowed monies. There would be a lot to gain for the banks if they could float the escrow payments for a few more months.

County Administrator Hemminger stated that the calls and e-mails coming into the County have related to tax payment due dates and are from banks and taxpayers of the County.

Commissioner Webster made a motion in accordance with the authority granted to Commissioners under Act 12 that the discount period for County real estate taxes be extended to August 31, 2020. There was no second to the motion. The motion died for lack of a second.

Commissioner Erb stated that he would like to take an opportunity to thank the Salvation Army and the various food banks for their efforts in making sure that no one is going hungry at this time of need. There are many churches and agencies in neighborhoods to help. These organizations have been assisted by volunteers who are making this effort possible. Nicole M. Hemminger, Chief Clerk
