9. NEW BUSINESS:

County Road 101 Rehabilitation Project:

Requesting approval for authorization of a Change Directive for the County Road 101 Rehabilitation Project as follows:

1. Milling was completed from Station 1+80 to the end of the project to expose the underlying concrete pavement. An inspection of the exposed concrete was completed to determine the required concrete patching. Three of the planned patches were eliminated (1+80 Lt, 3+25 Lt/Rt and 4+00 Lt/Rt). Also, several areas of additional required patching were identified (1+80 Lt, 5+90 Lt/Rt, 8+85 Lt/Rt, 9+25 Rt, and 10+85 Lt/Rt).

Estimated Net Quantity Change = 59 SY at a cost of \$5,821.00

2. During milling operations at Ramp C between Station 501+25 and the Sheetz entrance, it was determined that the remaining pavement in an area approximately 10' wide by 40' long will not have adequate pavement depth. As a result, this area will require excavation and placement of pavement base to reconstruct this area.

Estimated Net Cost Change = \$10,000.00

3. Milling to concrete at the north end of the project resulted in a pavement removal depth of +/- 7". It was estimated during design, based on average core depths, that the removal depth would be 5". Due to the increased depth, additional pavement binder will be required to bring the roadway surface back to existing elevations. The additional required quantity will be monitored as milling and construction progresses.

Estimated Net Cost Change = \$2,000.00 - \$3,000.00
