Commissioner Erb called for corrections or changes to the meeting minutes of 09/22/2020 and 09/23/2020. **There were no corrections noted.**

Motion by Commissioner Webster, seconded by Commissioner Burke and unanimously approved to accept the minutes as prepared.

Public Comment:

Commissioner Erb called for public comment.

Kay Stephens asked for an explanation as to what exactly Crowsnest plans to do for the county in terms of broadband services should the board vote to approve the agreement between the County and Crowsnest Broadband LLC listed on today's agenda.

Commissioners Comments:

Commissioner Erb called for commissioners comments.

Commissioner Webster stated that approximately 16,000+ absentee and mail-in ballots would be mailed this week. She stated that the deadline to request an absentee or mail-in ballot is 5 pm on Tuesday, October 27.

Commissioner Webster stated that if you choose to vote by mail, you must return your ballot by mail or by personally dropping the ballot off at the Voter Registration office located in the Courthouse Monday-Friday from 8 am to 4 pm.

Commissioner Webster stated that if you received an absentee or mail-in ballot but would rather vote in person at your precinct on November 3, you must turn in your blank ballot and envelopes to the poll workers at your precinct and vote. She stated that if you do not turn in your blank ballot and envelopes you would have to vote by provisional ballot.

Mrs. Illig stated that currently 82% of the \$50,000.00 allocation for housing assistance has been spent aiding 86 households with a high amount for rental assistance.

Mrs. Illig stated that two-2 years ago the county was able to provide funds to a number of low-income families for water and sewer projects.

Mrs. Illig stated that the Home Nursing Agency proposes to rehab the carriage house located on 12^{th} Avenue into a three-3 bedroom transitional housing unit.

Mr. Taylor stated that the grant amount for this period increased by \$53,472.00 for a total amount of \$505,540.00. He stated that the increased amount is to be used for training and preparedness programs for cyber and election security. The remaining amount will be used for planning, organization, equipment maintenance, training and exercise needs for acts of terrorism and other catastrophic events.

Coronavirus Relief Fund Recipient Grant Agreement:

Chief Clerk Hemminger requested approval of a Broadband Grant Coronavirus Relief Fund Recipient Agreement between the County of Blair and Crowsnest Broadband LLC for broadband internet deployment to unserved or underserved areas within the County of Blair grant award amount, on a reimbursement basis, not to exceed \$233,365.00, based upon completed deployment portion of the recipients overall deployment proposal up to December 30, 2020.

Mrs. Hemminger stated that the county allocated \$1,000,000.00 of the county's CARES Act funding award for broadband internet initiatives.

Mrs. Hemminger stated that once the grant application process for Broadband was announced only one-1 application was received from Crowsnest Broadband LLC, in an amount not to exceed \$233,365.00.

Mrs. Hemminger stated that initiatives proposed by Crowsnest include increasing capabilities to the four-4 existing towers serving the areas of the City of Altoona, Dunning's Highway, Lock Clappertown and Wopsy Mountain. She stated that new towers are proposed to be added to serve the areas of Sinking Valley, Frankstown, Bellwood and Tyrone.

Mrs. Hemminger stated that the grant is a reimbursable grant as new towers come on board and that all services must be operational by December 30, 2020.

Discussion followed.

Resolution 418-2020: A resolution approving a Broadband Grant Coronavirus Relief Fund Recipient Agreement between the County of Blair and Crowsnest Broadband LLC for broadband internet deployment to unserved or underserved areas within the County of Blair grant award amount, on a reimbursement basis, not to exceed \$233,365.00, based upon completed deployment portion of the recipients overall deployment proposal up to December 30, 2020.

Motion by Commissioner Erb, seconded by Commissioner Webster and unanimously approved to adopt Resolution 418-2020.

Salary Study:

Chief Clerk Hemminger read the following first two paragraphs from the narrative provided by East Coast as her summary/introduction to the Salary Study:

The goal of this classification and pay study was to create a comprehensive plan that is fair, equitable, and consistent with market factors. At the outset, we analyzed the positions currently held by approximately 500 full-time and part-time union and non-union employees – occupying approximately 2000 discrete jobs throughout all departments and offices of the County – and south to resolve any classification inequities that were disclosed in the course of this analysis. This was done with an eye toward reconciling pay relationships across the various positions and grouping together those positions that ought properly to be included within the same pay range.

As part of the study East Coast Risk Management ("ECRM") performed a market, pay analysis according to the comparable markets and pay strategy. We then developed and are recommending a pay scale based on this market selection and pay strategy. Thus, based on our compensable factoring and the selected market rates, we are recommending applicable pay grades for each position and pay steps at which each employee would be within the assigned grade.

Discussion followed.

Old Business:

Chief Clerk Hemminger stated that the county is still waiting receipt of the appropriate Certificate of Liability Insurance and Endorsements.
