COMMISSIONERS COMMENTS:

Commissioner Erb called for commissioner comments.

Commissioner Webster announced that she would like to take a moment to recognize the police throughout the County of Blair, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the United States for the most difficult, stressful, dangerous and selfless jobs they perform and to offer our thanks to them for the protection that they provide to each and every one of us and encouraged everyone to keep the police forces in our daily prayers.

Commissioner Burke stated that Governor Wolf announced this past February a \$297,000.00 investment primarily for carpenter pre-apprentice and apprentice grant programs in Allegheny, Blair and Lebanon Counties. She stated that Blair County was selected to receive grant funding because they are one of three training centers within the State of Pennsylvania with such a high demand for the carpenter program. The funding will provide the apprentices with four-year on the job paid training and classroom instruction at no cost to the apprentices.

SPECIAL ANNOUNCEMENTS: - 2020 Census Assistance Centers

Commissioner Erb announced that beginning this Thursday, March 12 households within Blair County will begin receiving letters with an invitation to respond to the 2020 Census and will contain instructions on how to do so. He stated that the average estimated time to complete the Census process is twelve-12 minutes.

Commissioner Erb stated that completion of the Census is strictly confidential and that participation in the Census is extremely important to ensure that maximum funding amounts are received by county and local community agencies.

Commissioner Webster stated that the Park and Recreation Advisory Board met this past Thursday and discussed the concerns of the Board of Commissioners pertaining to three (3) of the grant applications received.

Commissioner Webster stated that the advisory board feels that in their review of the applications in question the projects are quite similar to several grants awarded in the last several grant rounds. She stated that the advisory board is recommending that the Board of Commissioners award all six (6) grants based on what has been approved in the past; however, prior to the next grant round the advisory board would have the grant application revised to better clarify what the phrase, *"free and open to the public,"* actually means in relationship to Lakemont Park's operation.

Commissioner Webster stated that the advisory board feels that even though the Spring Cove Youth Baseball storage shed would be locked and not open to the public for use, it still would benefit the community as a whole by keeping relatively expensive equipment safe from potential theft and weather damage.

Commissioner Webster stated that with the exception of winter weather storage the soccer goals would remain on the Northern Blair County Recreation Center soccer fields for use by the public when not being used for scheduled soccer matches.

Commissioners Erb and Burke presented discussion concerning the remodeling of the press box at Veterans Memorial Field and felt that although the field would be open and free for use by the public, the press box would not be open at all times for public use.
